PASADENA FIELD RULES

BROOKSIDE 2:

- A BATTED BALL THAT ENDS UP IN THE PARKING LOT (BY ANY MEANS) IS A HOMERUN – even on a bounce, even off a tree or light pole, <u>AS LONG AS IT'S FAIR</u> (a foul ball is just a foul ball)
- **©** A BATTED BALL THAT ROLLS INTO THE **PLAYGROUND AREA OR THE RIGHT FIELD BATHROOM AREA IS LIVE**.
- THERE ARE NO GROUND RULE DOUBLES called on this field.

BROOKSIDE 3:

- A BATTED BALL THAT ENDS UP IN THE PARKING LOT (BY ANY MEANS) IS A
 HOMERUN even on a bounce, even off a tree or light pole, <u>AS LONG AS IT'S FAIR</u> (a foul ball is
 just a foul ball)
- A BATTED BALL HITTING THE <u>RIGHT FIELD</u> TREE IN "FAIR" TERRITORY IS A DEAD BALL-GROUND RULE DOUBLE ~ HITTING THE TREE IN FOUL TERRITORY IS JUST FOUL. YOU CANNOT CATCH A FOUL BALL OUT OF THE TREE.

JEFFERSON:

- A BATTED BALL HIT OVER ANY OUTFIELD FENCE "FAIR-OR-FOUL" IS AN OUT. If the ball hits a tree or a pole & goes OVER it is still OVER, and it's an OUT. If a batted ball hits a tree, or fence, or pole, or ANYTHING and lands back in FAIR PLAY the ball is LIVE.
- A BATTED BALL THAT FALLS THROUGH ANY HOLES IN THE OUTFIELD FENCING OR GETS STUCK IN THE OUTFIELD FENCING IS A DEAD BALL-GROUND RULE DOUBLE. Umpire judgement will be used on whether a ball went over vs through a hole to determine OUT or DOUBLE.
- © A BATTED BALL HITTING THE <u>LEFT FIELD</u> TREE IN "FAIR" TERRITORY IS A DEAD BALL-GROUND RULE DOUBLE ~ HITTING THE TREE IN FOUL TERRITORY IS JUST FOUL. YOU CANNOT CATCH A FOUL BALL OUT OF THE TREE.
